



# Hanby Building Facts

**1923** — Hanby was built in 1923 for \$169,069.00. It was used as a junior and senior high school

**1960** — Hanby was renamed Hanby Junior High School

**1980 through 1986** — Hanby housed 5<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup>, and 7<sup>th</sup> graders, then became a district office and overflow elementary

**2002** — Hanby began as a magnet school for Integrated Arts

**2003** — AC was installed here at Hanby. The school was housed in a wing on Central High School for the entire school year

**2012**— Central College and Longfellow math and science students merged with Hanby Arts creating Hanby Magnet School

**2013**— New windows were installed

**2014**— New doors were installed (doors and windows are similar to the original design of the building)

**2021**—New secured entry was installed moving the offices to the Park Street side of the building

## Hanby murals

In the basement we have a farm mural (**2008**) that was designed by our second graders, a quilt mural (**2009**) that was made by the third graders and a city mural designed by the older students. On the second floor we have an image of uptown Westerville buildings. (**2004**) We had a contest and the best third grade building design of each building was projected, then painted by students on a scaffold. We had an artistic parent outline the murals. Mrs. Gaus was a stupendous volunteer and made our lunch room mural. She also painted the fantasy mural outside the library (**2008**).

**2019**—We have a tile mosaic that was designed by a local artist working with our kids. Students added all the tiles to the fantasy village under the instruction of Vicki Murphy, Mosaic artist.
