

## **Information For Students Entering Westerville City Schools From a Foreign Country**

### **TB Test:**

**Students who are entering the Westerville School District from a foreign country must provide documentation of a negative TB test (Mantoux PPD preferred) or a negative chest X-ray from a physician or clinic in the United States prior to starting school.**

### **Immunization Records:**

**A copy of the student's immunization record should be presented at the time of registration if possible. If this is not available, the student should be started immediately on the series of DPT (DT if age 7 or older), polio (if under age 18), MMR and Hepatitis B (starting with Kindergartners of the 1999-2000 school year and progressively thereafter), Varicella (starting with Kindergartners of the 2006-2007 school year and progressively thereafter). This information must be on file within 14 school days in order for the student to remain in school.**

**Free immunizations are available through the Franklin County Board of Health (462-3635), the Columbus Health Department (645-7945) or the Delaware County Board of Health (740-368-1700). Please call for clinic times and locations.**

**Please note if you are taking your child for a TB Test and Immunization, the TB Test must be done first to prevent an interaction between the TB and the MMR.**
